An essay that is also a novel and a new form of memoir, Kate Briggs' This Little Art is a multilayered and sophisticated book that interrogates and ultimately celebrates the delights and

environment of those women asking questions while minutely and delicately observing their

complexities of reading, writing and living with/through translations. Starting from her experience of translating Roland Barthes's lecture notes, Kate threads numerous stories together to produce a portrait of her craft as an intensely relational activity. A recurrent image in the book: Robinson Crusoe's effort to "make a table for himself again for the first time".

Alain Cavalier is a writer and director who worked in the tradition of auteur cinema before experimenting with genres and developing a highly personal and unconventional style. Amongst his films, Le Combat dans l'ile (1962), L'Insoumis (1964), La Chamade (1965), Thérèse (1986), Un étrange voyage (1981) and Libera me (1993). He won several awards, including the César

Award for Best Film and César Award for Best Director for his film Thérèse (1987). His film Pater premiered at the 2011 Cannes Film Festival. Jesper List Thomsen is a Danish artist and writer based in London and Athens. Recent performances and exhibitions include Hollis and Money, ICA, London/ Künstlerhaus, Stuttgart; Speak Through You, Hot Wheels Projects, Athens; A Social Body Event, Serpentine Gallery, London; Micro-Composition, Rozenstraat, Amsterdam; The body, the body, the tongue, Reading Inter-

national; Hand and Mind, Grand Union, Birmingham; The boys the girls and the political, Lisson Gallery, London; One Hour Exhibition, South London Gallery, London. He is also a part of the artist collective Am Nuden Da. Kate Briggs is a writer and translator based in Rotterdam. She is the translator of two volumes of lecture and seminar notes by Roland Barthes (Columbia University Press, 2011 and 2013).
